The format for these presentations is listed below. The challenging process of grading these interesting and informative cases will be conducted by the previous years winners. There will be two categories for grading: the most difficult case with the best result and the best finished case. The winners last year were **Dr.'s Glenn Bloore, Milt Chan, and Ryoichi Niikura.**

The format for the cases will be as follows:

- A. Black binder containing:
  - 1. A summary sheet of pertinent case information on the outside cover: cephalometric analysis, type of malocclusion, non-extraction vs. extraction (include teeth removed), appliance and/or mechanics, treatment time, method of retention.
  - 2. Beginning records: photos, ceph and tracing, panoramic film.
  - 3. Final records: photos, ceph and tracing, panoramic film. Evaluation of results.

## Sunday, March 21

### Integrating Orthodontics with New Surgical Approaches

**Stephen Yen, D.M.D., Ph.D.**

This presentation will discuss new techniques for moving teeth and for moving bone. These techniques include an innovative Class III treatment for adolescents with cleft lip and palate that can correct large skeletal Class III malocclusions, novel applications of TADs, and dentoalveolar surgeries to accelerate tooth movement, reshape the alveolar archform and perform difficult tooth movements. This discussion will be supported by clinical cases and recent research studies by Dr. Yen. Finally, studies to control facial overgrowth syndromes will be presented with a discussion on future therapeutics.

**Stephen Yen, D.M.D., Ph.D.**

Dr. Stephen Yen attended dental school at the Harvard School of Dental Medicine, graduating with a D.M.D. degree in 1985. He received his Orthodontic training at the University of Southern California, earning a Certificate in Orthodontics and Ph.D. in Craniofacial Biology in 1993.

Dr. Yen currently holds the position of Associate Professor, Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery, Orthodontics, and Basic Sciences at the University of Southern California. He also holds the position of Orthodontic Attending, Craniofacial Team, Children's Hospital of Los Angeles, and Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery Department, USC School of Dentistry and USC/LAC Hospital, Los Angeles.

Dr. Yen is a Diplomate of the American Board of Orthodontics, and has several peer-reviewed publications, whose titles include: Late Maxillary Protraction Protocols for Patients with Cleft Lip and Palate; Implant-Supported Distraction Osteogenesis: a Technique to Advance the Deficient Maxilla; Clinical Applications of Orthodontic Microimplant Anchorage in Craniofacial Patients; and Combining Orthodontic Tooth Movement with Distraction Osteogenesis to Close Cleft Spaces and Improve Maxillary Arch Form in Cleft Lip and Palate Patients.

**G. William Arnett, D.D.S., F.A.C.D.**

Dr. Bill Arnett attended dental school at the University of Southern California, graduating with a D.D.S. degree in 1972. He received his Oral and Maxillofacial surgery residency training at the University of California at Los Angeles during the years 1972-1975. Since 1985, Dr. Arnett has limited his practice to facial deformities and from 2000 to the present, his practice has been limited to facial reconstruction research and surgical correction. As an educator in orthognathic surgery, he has faculty appointments at UCLA, USC, Loma Linda, UCSF, University of Texas at San Antonio, and the Universidad del Desarrollo in Santiago, Chile.

Dr. Arnett is a Diplomate of the American Board of Oral and Maxillofacial Surgery and holds membership in numerous organizations including the American Association of Oral and Maxillofacial surgeons and Fellowship in the American College of Dentists. He received the B.F. and Helen E. Dewel "paper of the year" Clinical Orthodontic Award by the American Association of Orthodontists for his paper published in the AJODO: Facial Keys to Orthodontic Diagnosis and Treatment Planning, Parts I and II. Dr. Arnett has been a featured speaker at many national and international meetings and has authored numerous scientific articles.
